What to do if you are concerned about a child

Safeguarding children is everyone's responsibility. Child protection means protecting children from physical, emotional or sexual abuse or neglect. It also means helping children to grow up into confident, healthy and happy adults. If you are concerned about the safety and welfare of a child in **Leicester city**, then please contact Leicester City Council or the Police, on the following telephone numbers.

Members of the public could visit Customer Services at 91 Granby Street, Leicester LE1 6FB where a telephone will be available to contact the Duty and Advice Service, <u>Children's</u> <u>Social Care</u>.

A social worker will talk to you about your concerns and will advice of any action required. The service is open 24 hours, 7 days a week, all year.

The service is also the first point of contact for all new ty children

A perseistent absent student is defined as a student who has 10% or more absence and who is aged between 5-15 years old.


At Present there are currently **18.3%** of children at school who are classed as Persistently absent. This equates to **38** children out of 213. This is above the National Average.
