

#### Persistent Absence at St Joseph's

A persistent absent student is defined as a student who has 10% or more absence and who is aged between 5-15 years old.

At Present there are currently 17.1% of children at school who are classed as Persistently absent. This equates to 37 children out of 216.

In comparison to National Persistnet Absence data which is currently at 17.1%
