Key Vocabulary

Watercolour: A type of paint that is mixed with water to create beautiful translucent effects on paper.

Media: The different materials and tools we use to make art.

Motif: A motif is a shape or picture that is repeated in a pattern.

Printing: This is when we press something onto paper to make a picture.

Observational drawing: This is when we look carefully at something and draw what we see.

Experiment: In art this means trying out new ideas, materials, or ways of making art.

Botanical art: This is when we draw or paint flowers, leaves, trees, or other plants.

Peel: To take off the skin of a fruit or vegetable.

Grate: To rub food on a tool to make tiny pieces.

Chop: To cut food into smaller pieces.

Tool: Something we use to help us prepare food like, knife or spoon.

Product: Something we make like a fruit salad or fruit kebab.

Key Vocabulary

plant: A living thing that grows in the earth. It grows from a seed and usually has a stem, leaves and roots.

stem: The long thin centre of the plant on which leaves grow. It carries water and minerals from the roots to the leaves.

leaves: The parts of a plant that are usually flat, thin and green.

roots: The part of a plant that are usually underground. They hold the plant in the ground and keep it upright. They take in water and food from the soil.

petal: The thin parts of a flower.

common wild and garden plants: Plants that are found often in the wild or in gardens.
